Our Commission, NCIC, was established with a firm commitment to promoting cohesion and integration in Kenya. We strive to foster a sense of inclusivity, unity, and shared aspirations amongst our diverse communities. We do not conduct ethnic audits simply as an exercise in compliance with legal mandates; rather, as an expression of our dedication to building a more just, equitable, and harmonious society. Today, I want to emphasize that **the goal of ethnic representation cannot be achieved through the efforts of a single organization**. It requires the collaborative efforts of numerous oversight institutions, political leaders, civil society, and, most importantly, all citizens.

The commission has lobbied the adoption of fair and inclusive employment policies in public institutions aimed at reducing discrimination on ethnic, racial and religious grounds by defining specific strategies to enhance inclusion of minority groups within the workplace.

In November last year, the Commission launched the **Ethnic and Diversity Audit Report** which served as a comprehensive analysis of the ethnic representation across the 47 county governments of Kenya. It revealed the extent to which we have achieved equitable ethnic distribution in Counties and it also highlighted areas that demand immediate attention. NCIC has collaborated with Daima Trust since 2017. We are glad that we are among the oldest partners to Daima Trust and by extension to the National Diversity and Inclusion Awards & Recognition project. The partnership focuses on nurturing creative and innovative ways of championing ethnic diversity in workplaces and promoting inclusion especially of ethnic minorities in Kenya. In 2018, NCIC has partnered with Daima Trust in this DIAR Awards, an incentive scheme that celebrates companies, parastatals, commissions, and counties, NGOs, CBOs and individuals who champion diversity and promote inclusion.

We are here today to celebrate with all of us and to urge us to continue in the spirit of many but one people. One people that belong to the human race.

Let this event be a springboard for action. That we leave here inspired, equipped, and connected. We go forth and become the architects of a better tomorrow. Together, we create a world where:

- Our planet thrives.
- All people live in peace and dignity.
- Shared prosperity lifts up communities.
- Future generations inherit a healthy and just world.
